RESEARCH NEWS

Report by Associate Professor Jyotsna Batra

Expected Outcome: is to improve prostate cancer diagnosis and prognosis. This in turn will be clinically vital as a predictive tool to aid diagnosis, prognosis, treatment decision making and capable of distinguishing clinically significant prostate cancer from indolent disease that does not require additional treatment.

We have achieved the following:

Progress for our proposed Aims. To develop a targeted mass-spectrometry based (MRM) approach to detect PSA and the genetic variants encoded proteoforms, we have optimised the MRM analysis set up and runs using our customized labelled synthetic peptides that are highly specific to PSA variants. We have tested the detection ability of these synthetic peptides (with >95% accuracy) to each variant in the whole proteome of cell lines (endogenous levels) and overexpression cell line models.

We then optimised detection ability utilising the labelled synthetic peptides in prostate cancer serum samples and observed that the serum proteins cause background interference in detection. We therefore have adapted serum depletion assays of prostate cancer patient serum samples (n=50) to remove the excessive serum proteins for the efficient detection of PSA protein. We are currently undertaking the depletion assays to deplete the abundant proteins that interferes with testing such as albumin. We have in addition included a novel splice variant of PSA expressed at higher levels in patients to improve the predictive outcome.

Procurement of additional patient samples (n=200) from the local cohort (APCB) and two international cohorts (MDC and VIP Swedish cohorts) are currently in progress.

Involvement in programs to enable commercialisation and clinical translation of the project outcomes:

To enable the commercialisation and increase impact, the team has enrolled in to the "Translation & Entrepreneurial Training Program" 2020.

We would like to acknowledge and give sincere thanks to all of the subcommittees who contributed towards the funding of this grant.

Scholarship Award

We are pleased to announce that a scholarship has been awarded to Bronwyn Jones in Rockhampton to undertake further studies in prostate cancer via La Trobe University distance education, which she will commence in Term 2, 2021. The funds were provided by the Westn' Breast & Prostate Cancer Support Group, our Barcaldine Subcommittee.

Bronwyn had received a scholarship towards her studies in breast cancer last year and hopes to work in both breast and prostate cancer departments. Many patients from the Central West region of Queensland travel to Rockhampton for treatment and Bronwyn will be able to utilize her gained knowledge to support many patients from Rockhampton to right across the central Queensland districts.

I am honoured to be the recipient of a scholarship to undertake the Prostate Nursing Care Course through La Trobe University to commence in August 2021.

This course will enable me to develop advanced knowledge and skill in the specialist practice area of prostate nursing care to provide evidence-based care and support to anyone affected by prostate cancer. This will also support my future aspirations in cancer care services to develop ongoing support and information programs including health prevention and promotion strategies as well as survivorship care planning. This will focus on enabling individuals to take greater control of their health for an improved quality of life after a cancer diagnosis.

I wish to express my extreme gratitude to the Central West Subcommittee of the Breast & Prostate Cancer Association of Qld Inc, West'n Breast & Prostate Cancer Support Group for providing the funds for this scholarship. As a health professional, it is encouraging to know these support groups value and acknowledge the need for further education towards specialised cancer care services in regional areas where services and support are not always readily available. I extend my thanks to each member for their dedication and commitment towards supporting and raising awareness and funds for those affected by breast and prostate cancer.

Thank you once again for this opportunity and I will endeavour to dedicate my learnings towards excellent individual experiences and health outcomes for those affected by breast and prostate cancer in rural and regional Queensland. - **Bronwyn Jones**


